ALERT

TO: Athletic Directors / Soccer Coaches

Because of tournament scheduling constraints there is a possibility of both the boys and girls soccer teams from the same high school hosting either a playdown or first round game on the same date.

The boys' and girls' soccer committees will make every effort to resolve such conflicts.

If the tournament committees are unable to resolve the conflict the following are suggestions offered to athletic directors:

1. The athletic director of the higher ranked team should attempt to secure an additional soccer field within the local community.
2. If #1 is not possible the athletic director should then attempt to secure an additional soccer field within the local athletic conference.
3. The athletic director will make the determination as to which home team (boys or girls soccer team) will play at the home field and which of the teams will travel to a home alternate site.
4. If resolutions #1 and #2 are impossible than one of the games must be played on the field of the lower ranked team.

It is the responsibility of the athletic director of the higher ranked team to communicate, with the athletic director of the lower ranked team regarding the resolution of the conflict.

If the resolution involves moving the boys soccer tournament game to an alternate site then the athletic director must contact Dick Danielson (646-3739), boys tournament director, immediately.

TO: All Girls Soccer Coaches
RE: General Instructions Regarding Game Management

Coaches check following items with each other:

- a. Directions how to reach field.
- b. All weekday games to START NO LATER THAN 2:00 p.m. Time for Saturday games will be announced later.
- c. Each team required to supply three (3) Brine International soccer balls.
- d. Arrange for color of jerseys of a contrasting color to these worn by the higher ranked team.
- e. No sweatsuits or warm-up pants may be worn on the field during the tournament play.
- f. Be certain of dressing arrangements prior to game.

NOTE:

- Home team secures officials in playdown and first round games. Girls Soccer Committee will secure officials for quarter-finals, semi-finals and finals.
- Visiting teams arrange for busses.
- Games to be played on home field of the higher ranked team in the pairings unless the home field is not a minimum of 65 x 110 yards.
- Both teams must call in scores to Carl Paquette, 233-9724 (W. Hartford) at the conclusion of the game.
- Rain date - play the next day (excluding Sundays). If field is still unplayable game may have to be played on lower ranked team's field.

SPECIAL NOTE:

- Coaches are requested to inform all site directors to honor the special game passes which are issued to soccer committee members who will act as observers during the tournament.

ATTENTION:

- The field should be freshly lined. Each goal provided with the customary net.
- A restraining barrier should be in place to keep spectators from the playing field at all points. In most cases crowd ropes will be considered suitable.
- Suitable benches should be provided for all players.
- A sufficiently large scorer's and timer's table with bench or chairs will be provided.
- A 35 yard line must be included on playing field for use if a shootout is necessary.

SPECIAL NOTE:

Addendum to Rule #12 (Tournament Rules)

1. At the completion of regulation time, a five-minute rest period will ensue prior to the two five-minute overtime periods. The two five-minute overtime and (if necessary)

DUTIES OF SOCCER TOURNAMENT SITE DIRECTOR

It shall be the duty of the Site Director to see that the following facilities are available well in advance of the start of the game:

1. THE FIELD SHOULD BE FRESHLY LINED, FOLLOWING OFFICIAL DIMENSIONS WITH FIELD MARKINGS IN AGREEMENT WITH THE MOST RECENT NATIONAL FEDERATION RULE BOOK SOCCER RULES. CORNER FLAGS ARE TO BE IN PLACE AND EACH GOAL SHOULD BE PROVIDED WITH THE CUSTOMARY NET.
2. A RESTRAINING BARRIER OF SOME SORT SHOULD BE IN PLACE TO KEEP SPECTATORS AT LEAST FIFTEEN FEET FROM THE PLAYING SURFACE AT ALL POINTS. IN MOST CASES CROWD ROPES WILL BE CONSIDERED SUITABLE.
3. An ADULT scorer and an ADULT timer will be provided by the Site Director and a sufficiently large scorer's and timer's table with bench or chairs will be made available for the game. The customary fee paid to adults performing these services is \$12.00 per game.
4. A suitable timing device -- the conventional time-clock -- and a loud horn or other loud noise-making device (not a whistle) will be available to signal the expiration of playing time. A gun should be used to signal the end of the quarters.
5. Sufficient uniformed policemen as may be deemed necessary will be on duty to control the anticipated crowd.
6. A doctor should be at least "on call" for the game. If at all feasible he should be at the site for the game. (Local physicians have been found willing to cooperate in such instances.)
7. SUITABLE BENCHES AND DRINKING WATER SHOULD BE PROVIDED FOR THE PLAYERS. IF A REQUEST IS MADE, DRESSING FACILITIES SHOULD BE PROVIDED FOR ANY TEAM WHICH HAS MORE THAN FIFTEEN MILES TO TRAVEL.
8. In the event that a field is absolutely unfit for play because of excessive water the Co-Tournament Directors should be notified as soon as possible. (After a rain most fields may not be perfectly dry, but yet would be suitable for play.)
9. The score of the game will be telephoned to the Co-Tournament Director immediately at the conclusion of the game. Calls may be made "COLLECT". Call Carl Paquette 233-9724 (West Hartford) -- NO LATER THAN 8:00 P.M.
10. All monies collected at the site along with ticket accountability should be sent to the tournament director, CIAC office, 84 Linden Avenue, Hamden, Ct. 06518. For accountability purposes (and for your records) payment (of all monies collected) to CIAC should be made by check (school/central office check). A list of expenses which includes all fees should accompany the money so the CIAC may then be able to make payment by check.
11. During the 1983 tournament the following passes will be honored at all games wherein a fee is charged:
